VIII. Interview Comments & Concerns:

Checklist of Items to Discuss with Applicant

_____ **Adoption Fee:** As of May 1, 2009: Puppies up to 6 months of age - \$350; Seven months to age 3 - \$300; Between ages 4 and 8 - \$225; 9 years and up - \$150 Adoption fees are non-refundable. Explain that MAESSR does not make a profit—all fees go to caring for Springers that we rescue.

_____ **Obedience Classes:** If a family adopts a MAESSR dog that is under 1 year old, we require the family to enroll the dog in obedience classes within 6 months of the adoption. If stated on the contract some dogs older than one may have the same requirement.

_____ **Contract:** Explain that they will be required to sign an adoption contract when they take possession of a MAESSR dog.

_____ **Dog Collar, Leash, & Tag Requirement:** These items **MUST** be brought with them when they go to pick up a dog. The tag does not have to have the pet's name, but it must have a phone number or address on it.

_____ Explain where our Springers come from (shelters and owner relinquishments). We do not breed dogs for placement. Availability of new dogs changes frequently.

_____ **Temperament Testing:** Explain that MAESSR temperament tests all dogs before placement and that we will not place any dogs that have a known history of biting.

_____ **Toddler Homes:** We will only place a dog in a home with toddlers if we know the dog's history and know that the dog is good around toddlers. We will not place a dog into a toddler home that was rescued as a stray from a shelter.

_____ **Homes with Cats:** We will only place cat-temperament-tested dogs in homes with cats.

_____ Families should wait at least 3 months after adopting another dog to adopt a dog from MAESSR. Likewise, we expect families not to adopt another dog less than 3 months after adopting a MAESSR dog.

_____ Explain that dogs adopted from MAESSR are indoor dogs and are not permitted to be outside unattended for hours at a time, tied up, or left outside at night.

_____ **Transportation:** Explain that MAESSR will assist with transportation whenever possible, but that the adopting family must also commit to driving at least 2 hours to pick up a dog.

_____ Explain that some dogs have a tendency to act up for a few weeks after placement and that they should expect an adjustment period. MAESSR is available to help families with any behavioral problems or training questions.

_____ Refer them to our FAQ web page and ask them to subscribe to the MAESSR e-mail list for updates on available dogs.

_____ **Waiting Period:** Tell them what the current waiting period is for adopting a dog.

_____ **Approval:** Tell them how they will be informed if approved for adoption. Explain to families that, once approved, our Adoption Coordinator will contact them when an appropriate dog is available. Ask them not to e-mail us about particular dogs on the website until they have received notification that they have been approved. (After they are approved they can email the appropriated Application Coordinator with interest in dogs on the list.

_____ **Offers:** Dogs are offered to the most appropriate family that has been waiting the longest. Families that are willing to adopt seniors or special needs dogs will be given priority. When families express an interest in a specific dog their application will be considered when it comes time to offer that dog but there is no guarantee about placement.

_____ **E-mail:** Ask them to check e-mail regularly for messages from us while waiting to adopt and to let us know if they will be away for extended periods of time.

_____ **Follow-up:** Adoptive families will be contacted by a volunteer post adoption. Please encourage families to keep contact information up to date (address, telephone & email) by sending any changes to maessrapps@yahoo.com or springersq@yahoo.com

Interview Summary Sample

Interview Summary
Applicant: Tina Fry
Date: July 23, 2003

Family & Lifestyle

Tina (33) & Michael (50) Fry live with their 7 year old daughter Lauren, 10 year old cat Moe & 7 month old ESS Max. Tina works from home so is there during the day. Lauren has been around dogs and is not afraid of them. She is looking forward to the day when Max is old enough to sleep in her room. No one in the household has any medical conditions or special needs.

Home Environment

The Fry's will be moving Aug. 8th. Their new home (which they will own) is a 5000 square foot house with a finished basement. The stairs down to the basement are carpeted but the stairs to the bedroom are not. They are planning to have a runner installed on those stairs. The home is in a rural area that is not close to a major road or highway. There is about ½ acre of the property that is fenced in with 4 - 4 1/2 foot fencing. They also have a pool that is completely fenced but separate from this fenced area that will be used for the dogs.

Other Pets

Max is a 7-month-old intact male ESS that they got as an 8-week-old puppy. He is scheduled to be neutered in September. He is good with other dogs & Tina has neighborhood dogs over to play with Max in her fenced in area. The Fry's also have a 10-11 year old indoor cat named Moe that they rescued from a shelter. He has only his back claws. He loves dogs. His litter box will be kept in the garage & they are installing a cat door (which they have in their current house). Tina says there are plenty of places for the cat to go if he needs to get away from the dogs. In the past the Fry's had a Chocolate Lab that had to be PTS at age 16 (old age) & a Rottweiler/Lab mix that also was PTS at age 15 (cancer). They have never given up a pet.

Both of the pets are current on shots. Max is on heartworm & flea/tick preventative. Max is currently going to obedience classes (he has been through puppy classes) and Tina has asked the instructor for hints on introducing a new dog in to the family.

Caring for Your Springer

Tina is aware of the needs of a Springer. They plan to exercise the new Springer along with Max at least twice a day by walking, playing ball or Frisbee and chasing around in the yard. Tina said she thinks of her pets as her children and cannot imagine giving one up. The dogs will always be leashed when off property. During the day, the dogs will be in the office with Tina or in the yard, which she is able to see from her office. They will only be out when someone is home to watch them. At night they will be in the finished basements in their crates. They plan to take the new Springer to obedience classes. Their philosophy on discipline is to reward good behavior and use a stern voice when necessary. Max is chipped and the new dog will be as well.

Springer Preferences

The Fry's dream dog would be a high energy, liver & white female between the ages of 1-3. They prefer a younger dog because of losing their other two dogs not that long ago. They are ready to adopt at any time.

My Two Cents

What a wonderful family. I think this would be a great home. It is obvious from talking to Tina that she is just thrilled with Max and wants a playmate for him. Max had to have eye surgery so she is delaying having him neutered until September (she didn't want both ends to hurt at the same time) but will push that up if his being intact would delay their getting a MAESSR dog. Their daughter Lauren has been around dogs all her life, not only their own dogs, but also neighbor's & other family member's dogs. Tina says she is very good with them. The Fry's seem to be very responsible pet owners and since they are used to having 2 dogs I don't think they will be overwhelmed by a new addition. I have no reservations about recommending them for adoption.
